Course Speakers Biographies



Professor Derek Knottenbelt

Principal Guest Speaker, Professor Derek Knottenbelt qualified from Edinburgh University in 1970 and after a 4-year spell in his native Zimbabwe working in the State Veterinary Service as a research officer, he moved into private practice in UK where he stayed for 12 years. During this time he developed an interest in equine medicine and so in 1985 he turned to the academic world first in Zimbabwe and from 1989 at Liverpool.

He has special interests in Internal Medicine and is mainly recognised for his contribution to equine oncology and dermatology and ophthalmology. He is a Diplomate of the European College of Equine Internal Medicine and holds a personal Chair in Equine Medicine at the University of Liverpool. He has published widely in both journal and textbook formats. He received the Animal Health Trust Scientific Award in 2003, the BEVA (Blue Cross) Welfare Award in 2004. He received the OBE in the Queens Birthday Honours of 2005 and the BHS Welfare Award in the same year. He is actively involved in domestic and international charities relating to equine welfare being on the executive and vet committees of SPANA, a trustee of SPEAR and regular consultant to ILPH. He is also President of Wirral and Chester RDA.



Kris Hughes

Kris graduated from the University of Sydney in 1995 and after working in mixed-animal practice returned to the University of Sydney in 1999 to undertake a residency in equine medicine. Seeking a change from the Australian sunshine and warm weather, Kris moved to the United Kingdom in 2005 to take the post of Senior Clinical Fellow in Equine Clinical Studies at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, University of Glasgow

a position that holds responsibilities for referral equine medicine service, undergraduate and post-graduate student teaching and clinical research.

Kris is a fellow of the Australian College of Veterinary Scientists in equine medicine and a diplomat of the European College of Equine Internal Medicine and while he interested in all aspects of internal medicine, particular clinical interests are in cardio-respiratory disease, metabolic disease, neurology, ophthalmology, intensive care and infectious disease.
